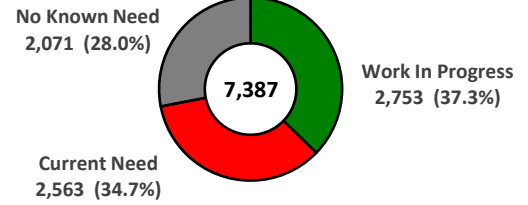

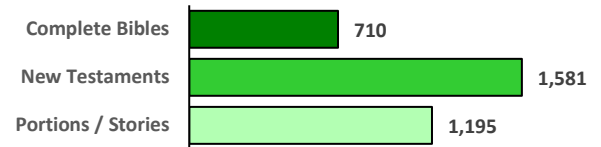


Translation Facts

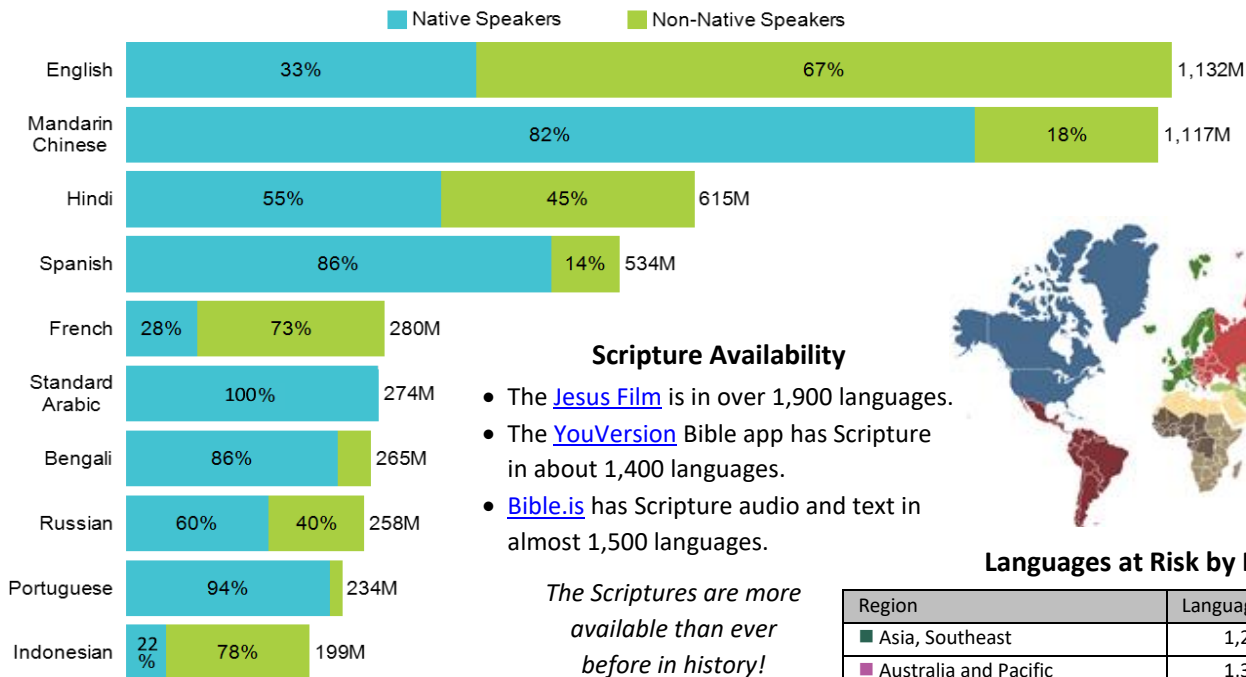
- In the late 1990s, Bible translators figured that at the then current rate of starting new translations it would not be until 2150 that work would have started in every language needing Bible translation.
- Better technology, improved use and training of national translators, and crowdsourcing have brought the timeframe down to about 2030.

Language Facts

- Two out of three people on earth speak one of the top 10 languages above.
- Less than 40 languages are used in universities across the world.
- Of the 7,300+ languages in the world, about one in five have fewer than 1,000 speakers and about one in 12 have less than 100 speakers.
- Languages are rapidly disappearing. Over 40% of living languages are currently considered at risk. Every 14 days a language dies. Linguists believe up to half of all languages could disappear in this century.
