Eastern Ghao-Xong in China



Fish swim in water, birds fly in the air, Miao live on the mountains. Today's people group, the Eastern Ghao-Xong, are one of the Miao peoples. The Eastern Ghao-Xong are the smaller but more independent of the two Ghao-Xong groups. Their villages arve on the northern mountaintops where they seek privacy in the eastern part of Hunan Province.

Ministry Obstacles

Traditional animistic religion holds a central role in Ghao life as they worship many deities, some of whom require blood sacrifice.

Outreach Ideas

Indigenously-led churches honoring their specific identifying tribal markers is key to reaching the Eastern Ghao-Xong. Their tradition of sprinkling a sacrificed pig's blood above the doorway alludes to the Passover, which represents a redemptive analogy for faith in sacrificial blood.
